Hunter Education Schedule

Manhattan Wildlife Association is hosting two Hunter Education classes this year.

Spring Hunter Education Session:

April 2, 3 & 6 – 7 to 9 PM
April 9, 10 & 13 – 7 to 9 PM
April 14 – 8:30 AM to 4 PM

Summer Hunter Education Session:

July 23, 24, 26, 27 – 6 to 9 PM
July 28 – 8:30 AM to 4 PM

They will be held at the Manhattan Wildlife Association - Logan Gun Club in the club house.

The twenty hour course includes instruction in wildlife management, firearms safety, hunter ethics, game identification, survival techniques and more. Participants must complete the entire program to receive their hunter education certificate (must attend all sessions).

Need to be 10 years old at time of class. Under Montana law, all residents born after January 1st 1985 must have a hunter education certificate in order to purchase a hunting license.

Participation in the class is encouraged, whether you plan to hunt or not, to learn proper firearms safety and handling.

Preregistration is required (at Manhattan Wildlife Association - Logan Gun Club):

March 19 – 6 to 7:30 PM
July 9 – 6 to 7:30 PM

Class is limited to 50 participants. A parent or guardian must attend preregistration for those under the age of 18 years old.

The course will be taught by Bob Logar, John Steele, Jim Aughney, Chuck Wambeke, Dale Kober, Walt Gordon, Sam Buckman, Ashlee Heavrin, Fred King and Mel Kieninger. Instructors are volunteers and there is no charge for the class.
