### Firearm Instruction

(Course for concealed Weapons Permit)

NRA approved courses are taught when there is sufficient interest. Upon completion the student receives two NRA certificates: NRA Home Firearms Safety and NRA First Step Pistol Orientation. This is the simplest way of meeting the required training prior to obtaining a concealed Weapons Permit.
