

Hunters Education

Manhattan Wildlife Association – Hunters Education program had a successful 2016. Approximately 100 participants went through the Hunters Education classes. Classes were held in April and August of 2016. They were held at the Logan Gun Club in the club house.

The twenty hour course includes instruction in wildlife management, firearms safety, hunter ethics, game identification, survival techniques and more. Participants must complete the entire program to receive their hunter education certificate (must attend all sessions).

Participants need to be 11 years old at time of class. Under Montana law, all residents born after January 1st 1985 must have a hunter education certificate in order to purchase a hunting license.

Participation in the class is encouraged, whether you plan to hunt or not, to learn proper firearms safety and handling. Class is limited to 50 participants. A parent or guardian must attend preregistration for those under the age of 18 years old. Manhattan Wildlife Association will be hosting two Hunters Education classes in 2017. Dates have not been set yet but there will be a spring and a summer class.

The course will be taught by Bob Logar, John Steele, Jim Aughney, Chuck Wambeke, Dale Kober, Walt Gordon, Sam Buckman, Ashlee Heavrin, Fred King and Mel Kieninger. Instructors are volunteers and there is no charge for the class.

If you are a new shooter or if you've never had good, formal instruction in handgun fundamentals, this is the course for you. It is perfect for before you take a concealed carry or armed self-defense course.

A pistol, or handgun, is a firearm designed to be fired while being held in just one or two hands. While such firearms are small, compact, and extremely useful, they can be the hardest to learn. That is why this course stresses safety, handgun grip, stance, sight alignment, sight picture, and trigger control. There are two phases in the course. Phase 1 is taken online and Phase 2 is outside shooting.

The cost is \$60 paid directly to the NRA when you sign up for the Phase 1 online portion of the course. For the Phase 2 shooting portion, the instructor time, ammunition, and access to a variety of handguns are all donated as a service to the members of our great range.

You do not need to own a handgun for this course. Handguns and ammunition can be provided. Please let me know if you are interested and we will help you signed up online with the NRA.
